



The Nebraska Northwestern Railroad (NNW) is Nebraska's newest rail operation, which began in April 2010.

It operates on 7.5 miles of ex-C&NW "Cowboy Line" trackage between Chadron and Crawford, Nebraska.

The logo was inspired from the old M&St.L (Minneapolis & St. Louis) Railway. Also unique are the current two locomotives that grace the roster. No. 303 is an SD18u (formerly DM&IR rebuilt SD9 No. 303). No.1506 is a GP7u (formerly Canadian Pacific).

At Crawford, the NNW connects with DME(CP) and BNSF. Primary traffic on this line is the movement of grain.
